## **PROJECT SNUGGLE-IN 2011**

*Conclusion to PC Palace Suppliers:*

### **Bophelo Creche**

What an uplifting experience this year's Snuggle-In Project were to all personnel involved!

Bophelo Creche was founded at the beginning of the year to help parents/grandparents who are unable to afford a crèche facility in Matwabeng township, which is about R70 per month. KMD saw this need when grandparents especially attended school children's functions with little ones tagging along as they had no means of sending them to pre-school. This resulted in unstimulated and bored little people. KMD then proceeded by renting premises from the local municipality and started the basic crèche facility with carpets, plastic tables and chairs and a few outside playing structures. Food is provided in the morning and afternoon from the kitchen shared by all the community projects.

At the moment Bophelo has 20 children, but will eventually cater for 30 children. Our stop at Bophelo Creche saw 12 little people who attended school on a Saturday especially to receive their gifts on a bitter cold Saturday morning. The joy when we handed colouring books, pencils, crayons, clay, paint holders, bouncing balls, puzzles, books, dress-up clothes including handbags, jewelery etc and beautiful fleece blankets wrapped in soft toys and mattresses were unbelievable. We were rewarded by 5 songs sung in Sotho and English and then a prayer before everybody enjoyed the sweets and cold drinks in their lucky packets. Precious, the teacher, is really a gem and the discipline, good manners and willingness to participate in activities astounded us all. We will definitely return in future to monitor and support this organization in uplifting these little angels.

### **Lesedi foster Home**

Our next stop was to Lesedi Foster Home, in the heart of Matwabeng township. This facility caters for 12 orphans. Their house consists of 4 bedrooms (one for the big boys, one for smaller boys, one for the girls and one for the house mother and her family) and one living room where cooking, studying and all social activities takes place. The biggest need here was for heaters in the bedrooms, tracksuits and sport activity equipment to use outside of the house and pritt for school tasks. We had a wonderful time, handing out heaters for the rooms, tracksuits for warm bodies, soccer balls, a rugby ball, a netball ball and cricket equipment and then participating in friendly matches with the kids.

### **Blanket distribution**

Our final task was to distribute the blankets. This year, we decided to do it differently and each personnel member was given a blanket to hand out to the most worthy recipient that they came across while driving out of Matwabeng township and into Senekal town as it was bitterly cold. This action supplied us with endless amusement as each personnel member selected his beneficiary, selected on his own criteria. The faces of the kids and adults that received a blanket out of a car window, accompanied by a smile, were priceless!

**Once again we would thank our supplies from the bottom of our hearts as we would not have been able to bring so much joy to these less privileged children and community if we did not have your support.**

**We definitely made a difference again this winter in lots of lives.**
